

## WWM INSTRUMENTAL IN RAISING OF \$1.55 MILLION FOR LEGAL SERVICES FOR CHICAGO'S POOR

Along with the attorneys and staff at Walker Wilcox Matousek LLP, a record number of more than 3,600 individuals made personal contributions during this year's Campaign for a new record total of more than \$1.55 million. At a time when more than half of low-income and disadvantaged Chicagoans who seek legal assistance (which is often critical to their safety and independence) are turned away and left to solve complex legal problems on their own, Chicago's legal community really came together and answered the call. Together, we are making our community a fairer and better place for everyone.
